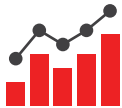

- 100% of investments go to mission

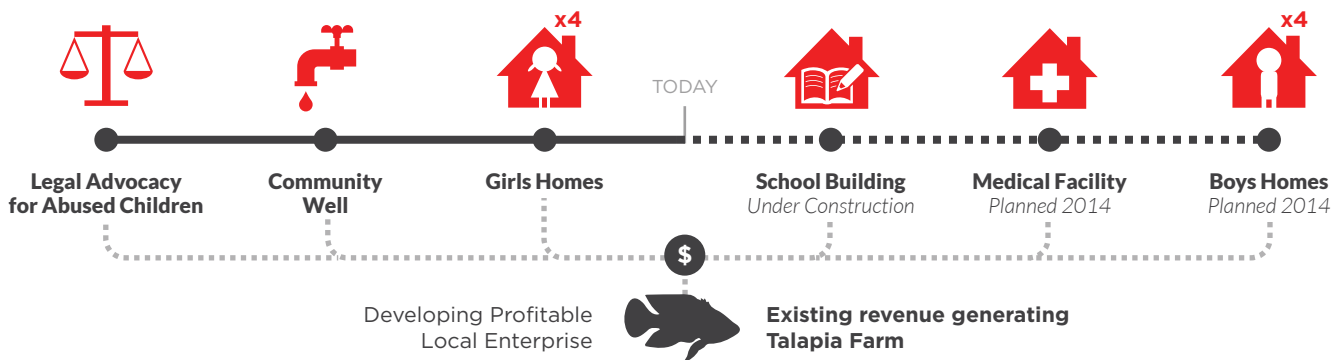


TRADITIONAL CHARITY MODEL
